SUMMARY

In the Monthly Statistical Report, the Barnet Food Hub Team compiles monthly statistical and quantitative data on food / support provided to its partners, for interested parties.

In the month of May, a total of 21,912 kg of food was distributed to our various partners saving a total of 58,045 kg of CO2 emission equivalents. Further information on support, additional resources that were provided and initiatives undertaken are detailed below.

MAY FOOD STATISTICS

The number of kilograms of food distributed from Barnet Food Hub, and the meal equivalents are shown below.

In addition, we include a metric which we have developed, to indicate the equivalent value of the food we give out.

Each week we purchase fresh fruit and vegetables and ambient produce to ensure that we can provide a consistent supply of ingredients to our foodbank communities. As a result of inflation, this food, which used to be bought from a budget of £1,500 per week, now costs considerably more than it used to – the same food costs around £2,238 per week at time of writing.

By additionally working with our food surplus chain and with help from our team of volunteers, we usually end up sending out between £10,000 - £15,000 worth of food each week.


When our society wastes food, we also waste all the energy and water it takes to grow, harvest, transport it and package it. If food goes to landfill and it rots, it produces methane which as a climate change gas, is 23 times more deadly than carbon dioxide, according to the Chartered Institute of Environmental Health (CIEH). They calculate that each tonne of food waste contributes to almost 4 tonnes of CO2 in greenhouse gas emissions; conversely each tonne of food that is rescued, contributes a saving of 4 tonnes of CO2 emissions.


The 'equivalent meals' figure is based on an average portion size for a meal weighing 420g (data derived from Food Portion Sizes, FSA 2008 and also from data from Waste and Resources Action Programme (WRAP), outlined within https://wrap.org.uk/sites/default/files2020-10/WRAP-Food%Surplus%Redistribution%20Estimate%202017%20-%20Information%20sheet.pdf. That document also contains a calculation of value for food waste at £3 per kilo.

The 'value of food distributed' figure is based on the price of the purchased food that we distribute, plus an average of £3 for kg of surplus food that we send out.

To ensure that the information remains legible, we have separated some of the data. The two charts below show the amount of food distributed during the course of 2021, and the food distributed during the course of 2022, into 2023.









FOODBANK DATA ANALYSIS

Our Foodbanks share with us monthly data on how their food is distributed throughout the Borough of Barnet. May data is available from our 18 Foodbanks.

This information is collated by Barnet Food Hub and displayed via Public Health on an interactive dashboard, which is available to view using the following link:

SUB-PROJECTS

Volunteers' Week

Throughout May, the Barnet Food Hub has been preparing for Volunteers' Week which takes place in the first week of June.

Groundwork London was awarded funding from the GLA Crisis Grant and this will be used to help support our provision for Volunteers' Week.

We designed and had printed enough 'Thank You' cards for each of the 18 Foodbanks in our network to give one to each person in their amazing teams of volunteers. A few of our Foodbanks have a very small (but usually incredibly loyal) team of just 4 – 6 volunteers, but others have many more; two of our Foodbanks have over 200 volunteers on their books and a very large team who reliably turn up each week.

The cards could be personalised with the Volunteer's name, or sent as they were if the Foodbanks lacked the capacity to personalise them all, and were gratefully received by Foodbanks as a way for them to acknowledge and show appreciation for the help they receive, without having to spend money on doing so, or expend energy and time which are of course at a premium for them.

This is only part of our provision and support for Volunteers' Week. In addition, we invited Volunteering Barnet along to our Network meetings to provide advice, guidance and ideas for how Foodbanks could celebrate and thank their volunteers, and we will also be providing free training sessions to Foodbank managers and their volunteers throughout June and July.
