How the money you raise will help

You'll be helping us grow our 'Space 2 Grow' Children & Young People's Fund which supports local community organisations, so they can deliver activities and services to children and young people in the London Borough of Barnet.

The fund gives children and young people facing challenges the opportunity to learn, develop, gain new skills and have fun in our community.

We cannot do it alone, we need everyone to pull together; support us, guide us, work with us so that we can be the best we can be, and, in turn, our children and young people will be able to access services and support which will enable them to achieve their full potential.

You are helping us to make a real difference to the lives of the London borough of Barnet's children & young people Since 2016 we've funded local organisations and projects over £120,000.

Here are some of the projects we've funded...




£2,340.00

Phoenix Canoe Club were funded to provide their site and activities to groups and individual young people from across the borough to explore the enjoyment of water.



£2,500.00

Harts Theatre Company (£2,500) were funded to deliver a 12 week drama project to show hard work is route to achievement and not gang culture.



£2,500.00

Art Against Knives were awarded funding for 1:1 mentoring support and wrap around service for their participants who are on the edges of or at risk of involvement with gangs.



£2,061.00

Jackson Lane was funded to delivery a 12 week workshop project to use theatre and role play to explore the issues relating to violence towards teenage girls.

Fabulous Fundraiser

Your motto is "the more the merrier". Your idea of fun is being surrounded by friends and family. You live for hosting parties and getting people together for dinner or tea parties.

Ways to be a fabulous fundraiser

- Time to party Host a dinner party, curry night, tea party or coffee morning where guests contribute donations to YBF.
 If you hold a dinner party, why not get everyone to pay for a plate or an entry fee.
- Got a competitive streak? Organise a friendly competition at home, work or in your community. A fun quiz night, sports tournament or singing contest you can charge a fee to play per round or for the whole evening.
- Fun night in. Turn your home into a cinema or beauty salon, sell tickets or treatments to family and friends. You can even charge for popcorn just like the real cinemas do.
- Party for a cause. Celebrate an occasion by asking for a donation to Young Barnet instead of a gift
- It's Showtime. Ask your talented friends and family to take part in a concert, charge an entry fee for the audience or make it a competition and charge to enter.
- Did someone say lunch? Find a local venue which offers a set meal price per head and charge people to come enjoy.

- A great way to raise additional funds is to incorporate an auction or raffle at your event
- Transform an ordinary event into a great one by choosing a theme
- Include an attraction like a band or local celebrity, to give people a chance to pose and share the event











The Maker

There are fundraisers who love to bake and then those who love to make. If this is you, you're the Maker. For you, handmade is always better than store bought. You're a regular at your local art shop, and you never miss a chance to take on a new project.

Ways to be The Maker

- Cake or Savoury Treat Sale. Get making and selling, all yummy treats you sell will help us to change lives of children and young people.
- Recipe Time. Ask friends and family for their favourite recipes and put them together to get them printed for resale.
- Artsy & Creative. Recruit your arty friends whether they be painters, knitters or sculptors. Sell your creations, with a percentage to go to YBF.
- Share, learn & have fun. Why not auction off your artistic skills to the highest bidder, hold a 1 on 1 painting session or sew a custom creation
- Competition Time. Want to be star baker? Or Upcycling Champion?
 Host a competition and charge people to enter and get a local business to donate a prize



- Make sure you tell buyers that you're raising funds – they may throw in some extra cash for a good cause.
- To save money on craft material, find recyclable items at home to upcycle into crafts
- Go seasonal, showcase seasonal ingredients when its flavour is best. It'll be cheaper too.

Caring Colleague

Helping the Young Barnet Foundation allows your business to make a visible, significant difference in our community

You're always looking to bring your co-workers together, so why not do this whilst raising money for a good cause. No matter your role, your vision can inspire a team to do great things.

Ways to be a Caring Colleague

- Let's go purple. Turn your workplace purple by hosting a purple themed day at work. Ask for donation to take part or bake some purple treats to sell.
- I want that! Have a workplace raffle, raffle off a coveted parking spot, free team lunch or annual leave day.
- Who's that baby? Charge an entry fee and offer a prize for the person who guesses which staff member is which baby photo.
- Fashion, Fashion. Get everyone to pay a couple of pounds to take part in a dress down day at work or ugly tie contest
- Office Collection Day. Stick a pot in the office and ask people to empty their pockets and donate small change to YBF
- Add or Share Your Skillset. You can learn at lunchtime by bringing in guest speakers and charge colleagues to join or share your skillset in return for a donation.







- Speak to your boss, to see if they will match the money you raise, doubling the amount given to YBF
- Spread the word by adding it to your email signature
- Take a lot of photos to show how your helping your community

Ways to be The Practical Joker

- Leave it to the professionals. If your jokes are not up to scratch why not have a comedy night with a local comedian. Negotiate a good deal and raise money from tickets sales, raffles & snacks.
- Fancy dress isn't just for Halloween. Why not organise a fancy-dress day at work and ask people to pay a small donation for the day?
- Yumminess & Messiness. Host a pie in the face fundraiser, the perfect way to have a fun and entertaining afternoon, people pay to enter.

- Pick a theme of fancy dress from the swinging sixties to Disney
- Use social media to promote your event and get friends to share your updates
- Get on stage and give it a go

- "Run Forest Run". Take part in a running challenge like a 10K or marathon to show how dedicated you are to supporting children and young people.
- Get on your bike. Ride in a bike challenge or a cycling trip, both are perfect for helping to change lives.
- Take the Plunge. Swimming is great for all ages and abilities plus they can be lots of fun.
- Sport-a-thon. Whether it will be a fitness-a-thon or gyma-thon get sponsored to spend if you can be doing your chosen activity.
- Tournament Time. You can set up a tournament for your favourite sport from football, cycling to walking.
- Tee off for YBF. Host an annual golf day
- Bowl for donations. Raise some cash by knocking down pins at your local alley, and charge a fee to each team that enters.



Fundraising Top Tips



- Decide on a date Check the calendar for the perfect day, just after payday is great
- Set a Fundraising Goal and Continue to Raise It - Make sure you work out a budget too and stick to it
- Write a List Put together a list of potential donors including friends, family, coworkers, work out buddies, etc
- Make it personal, get face to face or write some handwritten cards to ask friends and family you to support you by donating
- Most of all have lots of fun, if people see that you're having a good time they are more likely to support you













Spread The Word



Promoting your fundraising activity is vital if you want to maximise how much money you raise. The more people aware of what you're doing, the more donations you are likely to receive.

Social media offers a fantastic opportunity for you to raise sponsorship, from Facebook and Twitter to Snapchat and Instagram. Aside from social media you can also promote your Just Giving page in lots of other creative ways too.

- Enlist support of friends and family by getting them to share your updates


Make conversations based on your friends' updates and link it back to your page Make a video, brave it with Facebook Live or why not try Boomerang on Instagram
